

Sample language for including a gift in your Will to The Scott Mission

There are a number of ways to remember The Scott Mission in your Will. Please consult with your lawyer or financial advisor as to the type of gift best suited for your circumstances.

To give a specific amount

I give to The Scott Mission, 502 Spadina Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, the sum of XX thousand dollars (\$XX,XXX) for its general purposes.

To give a percentage of the estate

I give to The Scott Mission, 502 Spadina Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, twenty percent (20%) of the rest, residue, and remainder of my estate for its general operations.

To give a specific asset, such as shares in a company

I give to The Scott Mission, 502 Spadina Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, 500 shares of ABC Co. Inc for its general purposes.

For a gift contingent upon a certain condition

In the event that my brother does not survive me, I give the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$XXX,XXX) to The Scott Mission, 502 Spadina Avenue, Toronto, Ontario for its general purposes.

To designate your gift for a specific purpose:

I give to The Scott Mission, 502 Spadina Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, the sum of XX thousand dollars (\$XX,XXX) to be used in support of the Scott Mission Camp. We suggest that you add a "Power to Vary" clause, for example "If at the time of my death it is impossible, impractical, or inadvisable to apply the gift to this purpose, The Scott Mission may at their discretion direct the gift to a similar purpose."
