CLEAR is proud to have funded 36 researchers since 2017, which on average, is 7 dementia research projects per year. Our allocation of funds ensures the promotion of innovation, synergism and collaboration while maintaining our independence.

To date, the Foundation has committed to \$16 million of research, leveraging its impact to over \$25 million through partnerships with Michael Smith Health Research BC, Brain Canada, Genome BC and the Alzheimer Society of Canada.

Canada's Dementia Crisis


Dementia is a growing concern in Canada, with the number of people affected by the disease rising due to our country's aging population.

Dementia also has a significant impact on Canadian healthcare costs (an estimated \$10.4 billion annually). The care needs of people living with dementia are often complex, including direct costs (healthcare services) and indirect costs (lost productivity and caregiver burden).


Dementia is a death sentence on the rise.

Dementia is already the <u>8th</u> <u>leading cause of death</u> in Canada. On average, 1 in 5 Canadians has experienced first-hand the tragedy of this disease, with 100 new families dealing with a diagnosis of a loved one every day.

The need for increased dementia research funding is critical to improving our understanding of the disease, advancing care treatments, and enabling better support for people diagnosed and their care partners while reducing its economic and social burden.
