

Who We Are

Royal Canadian Marine Search and Rescue (RCMSAR) is a not-for-profit, registered charity that operates a volunteer marine search and rescue service in the coastal and in-land waters of British Columbia. RCMSAR volunteer emergency response crews at **31 stations** are **on-call 24 hours a day**, seven days a week and respond to an average of 500 search and rescue (SAR) calls each year, saving hundreds of lives and recovering hundreds of thousands of dollars in property.

Our Volunteers

RCMSAR has developed a SAR training program that is both professional, and one of the best in Canada. Our volunteers receive extensive training, both on the water and shoreside, to prepare them to respond to taskings from the JRCC. Currently,

- RCMSAR has more than 900 volunteers that includes both operational crew and supporting members
- All station personnel are highly trained and equipped with specialized rescue vessels designed for the navigational challenges of the West Coast
- Over 57,000 volunteer hours are spent annually on missions, maintenance, training and more

How We Save Lives

RCMSAR is a key part of the marine search and rescue (SAR) system, working in one of the most challenging SAR regions in the world. Through an agreement with the Canadian Coast Guard, RCMSAR responds to marine emergencies tasked by the Joint Rescue Coordination Centre (JRCC) in Victoria. We provide support for on-the-water humanitarian aid when called upon by provincial authorities, local communities, Indigenous partners, and other first responder agencies. Our Impact

In the last 12 months (October 2021–October 2022), RCMSAR volunteers at 31 marine search and rescue stations:



Conducted 440 Missions of which 67% of all calls for help occurred during the day



Had an average Response Time of 18.62 min and average Mission Duration of 2.25 hrs



Assisted 364 people on the water and saved 56 lives



47 Fast Response Craft Assets across the province
